13170 Jean Marie Savary Duc de Rovigio. **MEMOIRS OF THE DUKE OF ROVIGIO.** L: 1828 1st ed. in English. Four volumes: over 2000 pages. Bound by Zaehnsdorf in half red leather and marbled boards. Marbled endpapers; silk ribbon bookmarkers; spine blocked and ruled in gilt. A fine set. \$1000

*A FINE SET OF THESE MEMOIRS BOUND BY THE FAMED ZAEHNSDORF BINDERY. Savary, a French general, was Napoleon's aide in Egypt; he became Chief of the Secret Police during the Consulship and a divisional army commander by 1805. He replaced Fouché as Minister of Police in 1810 and remained with Napoleon to the end but was not permitted by the British to accompany the emperor to St. Helena. His memoirs are both scarce and valuable; this particular set is especially nice.*

2001 Antoine Marie Chamans Lavalette. **MEMOIRS OF COUNT LAVALETTE.** L: 1831 1st English edition. Two vols. Recently rebound in half leather with marbled boards. A fine set. \$1000

*WITH A ONE-PAGE LETTER SIGNED BY LAVALETTE. The scarce first edition of these important memoirs of the Napoleonic era. Lavalette was one of Napoleon's top aides. He attached himself to Bonaparte at the beginning of the emperor's rise to power and served him well in a number of diplomatic roles. Lavalette was appointed Postmaster General after Brumaire and held that office until Napoleon's exile. He was condemned to death after Waterloo but escaped and lived a long life. His MEMOIRS are noted for being well-written and supplying much information on the Italian and Egyptian Campaigns (in which Lavalette accompanied Napoleon) as well as presenting a vivid picture of Napoleon's return to Paris after the disastrous 1812 Russian Campaign.*

*Includes an original letter signed by Lavalette. The letter (dated 8 June 1815) is in a secretarial hand and is signed "Lavalette." The letter dates only ten days before the Battle of Waterloo and is an official communication relating to the Postal*

*Department.*

*Complete edition of the sinister De Montholon's memoirs. He is accused by some of murdering Napoleon but his memoirs form one of our most important sources for the St. Helena exile.*

*A handsome copy of this rare study of the Prussian field-marshal. The binding is by the famed Zaehnsdorf Bindery. Illustrated with seven hand-colored battle maps. The author was one of Blucher's top aides as well as a famed military strategist.*

*Rare. Sarrazin wrote the first general history of the Peninsular War but found it overshadowed by the numerous works published later. His work is today very scarce and largely unknown. Sarrazin served in the French Army and was Chief of Staff to the Swedish Corps which served under Bonaparte. In 1810 he offered his service to the Allies and Louis XV. Horward 3638 lists a different edition published the same year but with fewer pages.*

*First edition of this translation of Ramel's memoirs. This work was originally translated in 1799 under the title NARRATIVE OF THE DEPORTATION TO CAYENNE. Ramel's narrative tells of the revolution of 18th Fructidor; his deportation to French Guiana; and his escape via Surinam. Scarce.*

*Scarce biography of the French general with much on his efforts in the 1796 Campaign.*

*Scarce study of British diplomacy and statesmanship during the Napoleonic Wars. Fortescue is best known for his multi-volume HISTORY OF THE BRITISH ARMY. This copy is attractively bound in a clean elegant blue leather binding.*

*Classic military study of Napoleon. Jomini was one of the leading military theorists of the 19th century and originally wrote this work in French in the 1830s. This edition was translated and edited by H.W. Halleck. The atlas volume contains 60 full-page hand-colored battle maps.*

This study of Waterloo was first published as a chapter in his four-volume work on Napoleon's campaigns. It was expanded into a separate book published in Paris in 1839. This translation was done by a West Point graduate. A rare work by a great military thinker.*

*INSCRIBED BY THE TRANSLATOR TO GENERAL CALVERT. Calvert was one of the top French commanders of the day. This book is an important work on French tactics of the Napoleonic Era. The second volumes consists of 40 folding plates depicting manevre with accompanying explanatory text. The first volume is a detailed study of French Army field exercise.*

*IMPORTANT MEMOIRS OF THE AUSTRIAN DIPLOMAT. Metternich was one of Napoleon's chief opponets and played a major role in developing the Alliance which would finally defeat the Emperor. He was Austria's chief diplomat for nearly 40 years and at first worked closely with Napoleon by arranging the Treaty of Fountainbleu in 1807 and Bonaparte's marriage to Marie-Louise two years later. He eventually led Austria into war and was the leader of the Congress of Vienna. He would be one of Europe's top diplomats until 1848 and is one of the outstanding figures of 19th-century Europe. Metternich's memoirs were arranged and published by his son in the 1880s. The French edition comprises eight volumes. The English edition is found in five volumes and ends in 1835. The autobiographical sketches are somewhat fragmentary as Metternich did not complete his book but the various documents and letters provided to flesh out the narrative contain a wealth of important information.*
